The tour begins at [Cincy Haus](#), located at 1218 Vine Street in historic [Over-The-Rhine](#), where guides debrief you on the basics of ghost hunting and how to use your "ghost meter" which detects small electromagnetic field fluctuations. You will be asked to sign a waiver, as the tour will wind you through tunnels, steep staircases, and buildings that have seen better days.
